#### Introduction

#### **Outline of Council**

**Narberth Town Council** serves the area of Narberth and Crinow and its electorate of around 2293. It has 12 councillors, although currently there are three vacant seats, covering two wards: Narberth Urban and Narberth Rural. As democratically elected local representatives, the councillors have a unique and privileged position and the potential to make a real difference to people's lives. Narberth Town Council is the level of government closest to the community, with Pembrokeshire County Council above it in hierarchy.

The Town Council employs 1 part-time member of staff.

## Financial Summary 2023-2024

The Council precept is the main source of income and represents the amount of council tax paid by households in Narberth that is allocated to the Town Council. The annual precept (£60.93 per Band D household) raised a total of £83,000 for the Town Council during 2023/2024. The Town Council also received other income of £7,530. The Council retains general reserves in excess of £60,000 to deal with unforeseen emergencies.
